Mr. Charles Lorenz of the National Tuberculosis Association made several trips to the city, went over newspaper files, consulted with Rev. Alexander G. Cummins, with the printer of the seal and others, and is convinced that it was issued for tuberculosis relief and that the city wanted all the funds derived from the sale instead of sharing with the national Red Cross drives of 1908 and 1909. No Cuban Seal for 1944 The post office department at Havana, Cuba writes that there was no semi-postal issue for 1944-45 for the use of the tuber-culosis work on the island. This little seal has appeared regularly each fall in Cuba, sells for a cent and its use is compulsory on all letters during a short period. The receipts from the sale go to the children's hospital for TB research.
