Rajasthan, one of the 14 States of the Union of India, is a vast desert area with many oases which form the nucleus of many rich, princely states before Independence. From the history of these states, palaces and forts come the great stories of famous Rajput chivalry, folk-lore, romantic legend and traditions.

At the foot of the rugged and pictureque Aravalli Hills at Madar, near Ajmer, is a Tuberculosis Sanatorium. The director of this famous institution is Dr. Sherwood Hall who built it up. Dr. Hall was educated at Mount Union College, Alliance, Ohio, and received his medical training at the University of Toronto, Canada and Post Graduate work at London, England. He has a fine record of service in Korea and was the founder and director of the first T. B. Sanatorium of that country, for which he was decorated by the Emperor of Japan.

This progressive Centre at Madar not only cures chest diseases but carries on a programme of prevention and rehabilitation. We highly commend Dr. Hall and his associates in their initiative of forming a programme of education and propaganda to enlighten people against the inroads of this dread disease. T. B. Seals which have become a regular feature of this country were first introduced by Dr. Hall in Madar.

Madar now has 14 wards and 25 cottages, a lovely new Surgical Block, a most modern Post Operative Block with Recovery Rooms, a Recreation Hall, Occupational and Rehabilitation Buildings, a very efficiently run Public Health and Tuberculosis prevention Clinic, a Family Planning Clinic, a Day Nursery, a School, and a Sanatorium Farm.

Another happy feature of the work at Madar is its extension work of Public Health and Family Planning Clinics. This Department is directed by Dr. (Mrs.) Marian Hall. St. Paul saw a vision of a man of Macedonia, calling him to help, but we have hundreds of poor people as seen in the picture on this page, who come to Dr. Marian for help. The Mobile Health Unit goes about the country with or without roads, holding weekly clinics and aiding hundreds of desperate and needy people. We commend Dr. Marian and her associates for creating a wonderful good-will and confidence between themselves and the village people.

In conclusion we wish to thank Bishop Newell and the friends in New York area, for their interest in our work at Madar, especially for their help in the laying of a very fine water supply system at Madar. We wish to thank also all our friends and patrons, who are supporting the work at Madar.
