## CHRIST CHILD SEAL SALE ON TOMORROW

More Than 1,500 Appeals Already Received by Society for Christ-

mas Needs.

The annual sale of Christ Child Christmas seals will open tomorrow in stores, banks and hotel lobbles in Washington. The proceeds from the sales of these

stamps will be utilized to bring cheer into otherwise dark little lives during the Yuletide by providing toys, can-dies and fruits. When the need exists, the Christ Child Society this year, as in the previous 36 years of its activities, will provide warm clothing and shoes.

More than 1,500 appeals have thus far been received by the society for Christmas needs this year. More than a hundred volunteer workers are engaged in the task of looking into cases. Later their time will be occupied in purchasing and delivering the gifts asked for in the letters.

The annual report of the society shows that last season 4,983 gurments were distributed in the course of the year, 450 pairs of shoes were given away at Christmas time; 150 children were sent during the Summer to the Christ Child Home near Rockville: 663 children received free treatment at the dental clinic in the headquarters building, 324 Indiana avenue, and 351 children attended settlement branches of the organization.

Miss Mary Meerick, an invalid, is the president and founder of the organization. Mrs. James Dudley Morgan is first vice president, Mme, Ignaclo Claderon second vice president, Mrs. Charles P. Niell recording secretary, Miss Gower corresponding secretary and Miss Katherine Holbrook treasurer.
